#### **EMERGENCY CONTACTS**

For the safety of your child/ren, please be sure your emergency contact is a person who lives <u>locally</u> and could pick up your child should he/she be ill or miss the bus. Please **update** all contact information on Genesis.

Also, if your home phone number changes, this must be changed through the Registration Office at (609) 716-5000 x5505. Please be sure to update a change in your business, cell or emergency telephone numbers on your Genesis Account.

#### **PARENT PICK-UP**

All parents/guardians or babysitters must come to the front office when picking up their child/ren from school *prior* to 3:15 p.m. At 3:15 p.m., parents should go to **Room 18** to pick up their child/ren. Children will not be permitted to leave the school building without an adult signing them out.

It is located at the security officer's desk and is our check-in/check-out system. Please make sure you have proper photo identification (i.e., Driver's license) to show the officer when you come into the building. Upon leaving, please return your visitor's pass back to the security officer. If the officer is not at the desk when leaving, please place your pass on the security desk.

#### GENESIS NOTIFY ATTENDANCE OFFICE



PLEASE LOG IN YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE ON GENESIS.

When you log in, click on NOTIFY ATTENDANCE OFFICE and report your child's absence. The Board of Education requires each parent to notify the school by the morning of any absence. In the event a parent does not notify the school, a phone call will be made to the parent. In the event the parent cannot be reached by phone, a police officer will visit the home. This policy has been adopted to insure the safe arrival of your child at school each day. Your cooperation will make this an effective policy.

# SCHOOL ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE PROCEDURES:

#### TOO EARLY - TOO LATE

Drop off time for Wicoff School is 8:40 – 8:55 a.m. Prior to 8:40 a.m. there is no supervision for students unless they are in the Extended Day Program (EDP).

If your child arrives after 8:55 a.m., he/she is considered LATE and marked tardy. More importantly, your child misses morning organization and orientation time in the classroom. Students arriving after 8:55 a.m. must stop in the office for a late pass.

Please have your child arrive at Wicoff between 8:40 and 8:55 a.m.

If a student is arriving by car, it is important to remember that automobiles are not permitted to park in the main driveway. (Also, if cars drive through the main driveway during school arrival and departure times, they run the risk of getting stuck between buses, since this is a one-car lane.) Free access to the parking lots by the church must be maintained for all vehicles. Parking spaces are also provided in the church parking lot.

Bus transportation is provided by the Board of Education. Each child has been assigned a bus stop. For the safety of your child and others please encourage proper conduct at the bus stop as well as on the bus.

Any child who fails to conduct him/herself in a safe and courteous manner will be reported to the principal. If the behavior does not improve, a Bus Conduct Form will be completed by the bus driver. The principal or assistant principal will then meet with your child to discuss the inappropriate behavior. Upon receipt of the conduct report, the principal will contact the parents to discuss strategies to improve behavior.

All children are screened for height, weight, blood pressure, vision and hearing each year. It is essential for your child's education that he/she is able to see and hear properly. 
#### **REMINDER: Medication Policy –**

If any medication must be administered to a student during school hours, it MUST be submitted under the following conditions to the nurse:

a. The approved school district form (available in the school nurse's office and on the district website at ww-p.org) for the "Administration of Medication in School" must be completed by the student's physician, and signed by the parent.

b. The form and the container with the pharmacist's label designating patient's name, instructions, name of drug and name of physician must be given to the nurse by the parent.

All lunch payments can be paid by cash or check written out to YOUR CHILD'S SCHOOL NAME CAFETERIA (e.g., Wicoff Cafeteria), or online through My School Bucks. My School Bucks (https://www.myschoolbucks.com/) has a web site where parents can read information about school lunches and nutrition, as well as information about how to manage a student's online lunch account. To access your account, parents and students need to know the child's Lunch PIN number. If you do not know the Lunch PIN number, it can be found in your child's Genesis account. If your child does not have a Lunch PIN number please send an e-mail to marcey.behler@ww-p.org and you will receive an e-mail response with the information; please include your child's name and school in your email.

Money for lunches can be sent in for lunches only or for both lunches and snacks. If you want lunches only, please write that on the envelope with the lunch payment. When sending in lunch money please include your child's name on the bottom of the check or on the envelope.

Charging of lunches is highly discouraged. However, if a child should forget or lose his/her lunch or lunch money he/she will be permitted to charge lunch for the day. Should it be necessary
