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EDP EMERGENCY CLOSING PROCEDURES

The following procedures will be followed for currently enrolled EDP students:

All children can ride the school bus home, plan for parent pick up (<u>must pick up</u> before 1:00 pm), arrange an alternative bus stop (<u>must contact transportation for an alternate form</u>) or walk, if they are listed as walkers.

The Season


