KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION & KINDERGARTEN - EXTENSION REGISTRATION



Information regarding kindergarten registration for the 2020-2021 school year is available on the WW-P web site (www.ww-p.org). Registration takes place at Central Office, 321 Village Road East, West Windsor (609)716-5000 and is by appointment only.

Kindergarten registration for the 2020-2021 school year is for children who will be 5 years of age on or before October 1, 2020. Registration begins on January 6, 2020.

The Kindergarten Extension (KE) Program provides a safe and convenient extension of the Kindergarten school day providing developmentally appropriate enrichment activities enhancing regular half-day Kindergarten. The KE Program runs five days a week; the morning program begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 12:15 p.m. The afternoon program begins at 11:45 p.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. All KE students must provide a nut-free lunch.

KE has limited enrollment and there is a high demand. KE registration will be on a first-come first-served basis. Parents may register for KE on the district website under "Community Education."

EDP EMERGENCY CLOSING PROCEDURES

The following procedures will be followed for currently enrolled EDP students:

EDP is **not** available when school is canceled at 1:00 p.m. due to a weather emergency. All children will ride the school bus home or to a pre-arranged stop (or walk, if they are listed as walkers) if schools close early for emergency conditions.

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If parents plan to pick up children at their school, it must be done before the early closing time, as there will be no gathering place for children to wait to be picked up.

Lice outbreaks commonly increase when children come together in social groups. Now that the children are back in school from winter break and other community

activities, it is time for you to periodically check your child's head for lice. This is the best preventative measure to curtail lice infestation.

When checking:

It helps to use a magnifying glass and natural daylight. Divide the hair in sections and fasten off the portion of hair that is not being examined at the time. Closely examine hair nearer the scalp. Lice may be hard to locate, so look for small, grayish-white or yellowish-white eggs (nits) attached to the hair. These nits can sometimes be mistaken for dandruff, but they cannot be easily brushed or blown away.

If lice or nits are found:

- Contact your physician for a recommended treatment. Treatment instructions should be strictly followed.
- Examine all family members, daily, for at least two weeks.
- Notify school nurse immediately. (This information will remain <u>confidential</u>.)
- Inspection of classmates and friends will help to prevent further spread of lice.
- Notify close personal contacts.

Because lice outbreaks are common among school children and even the cleanest child can easily become infested, parents are encouraged to make checking for head lice a part of routine hygiene. A cooperative effort between home and school will enhance efforts to control the spread of head lice in our community.
