## From Mr. Argese and Mrs. Bruce

- Thank you to all parents who recently visited Dutch Neck during parent/teacher conferences. We value the partnership we have with you by working together to teach and support your children.
- On Wednesday Oct. 23, we had our second All School Meeting which focused on EMPATHY. Prior to the meeting, children learned about empathy during read alouds, activities, videos, and discussions. We were very proud of the first grade students who led the meeting. The assembly began with a definition of empathy followed by the Pledge of Allegiance, singing the Dutch Neck School Song, and singing Happy Birthday in English and Spanish to those celebrating a birthday in October. We had the opportunity to deepen our understanding of what it means to be empathetic by watching two short videos and a student skit along with

- sharing ways in which people show empathy. Children were also challenged to think about how they might demonstrate empathy in the future.
- Mr. Argese and Mrs. Bruce recently visited all second and third grade classrooms
  to read to the students. In second grade, we read the book <u>A Fine, Fine School</u>
  and in third grade, we read <u>The Eagle and the Wren</u>. Please ask your second or

Dear Parents,

Dutch Neck Elementary School is getting ready for our annual Halloween celebration which will be on Thursday, Oct. 31! Everyone is excited for our annual tradition of the Halloween parade and class party where we can see our friends in their costumes. Please see the information below that shares details of the day so that our event can be safe and enjoyable for all.

We at Dutch Neck Elementary School believe in a peaceful school environment where our children learn to make appropriate choices. We are asking for your help in guiding your child to choose a costume that will be child-friendly and suitable for school; therefore, your child should not wear any costume that promotes violence in any way (no weapons, toy guns, swords, etc. will be permitted). Any accessories that may cause a distraction, including any hand-held items should be left at home. This will assure that nothing will be left in school that may be needed later in the day for trick-or-treating.

If you choose not to have your child participate in the parade and/or class party, a handwritten note should be given to your child's teacher by **Monday, Oct. 28**. An alternative, educational activity will be provided for those children who are not participating in the Halloween celebration.

Your child's teacher will give you more specific information about his/her schedule for that day. Parade start times are listed below. Parking is available at Windsor Chapel; however, please do not park on the grass. NOTE THAT THE PARADE IS WEATHER PERMITTING. IF IT RAINS, CHILDREN WILL SIMPLY HAVE THEIR CLASS PARTY. The parade will begin on the blacktop, go on the walking track past the Dutch Neck Garden, and then students will re-enter the building by the gym. Please note that only students and staff will be allowed in the gym entrance. Because of the number of Halloween parties occurring throughout the day, we cannot allow visitors into the building.
