To get a better understanding of this process, high school administrators and content supervisors will be hosting a Program of Studies Orientation for 8th grade Community Middle School parents at the **HS North Auditorium Thursday, Feb. 6, 2020, 7 p.m.** Curriculum details, scheduling procedures and the importance of making sound course selections will be reviewed. The information provided at this forum will be of great assistance as you and your child plan courses for next year.

#### **Reminders:**

- For everyone's safety, please do not drop-off your child in the main parking lot and follow the directions of district staff members supervising drop-off procedures.
