Please keep in mind that teachers will also be on break during this time and may not be available for contact. The principal team will be monitoring email, so should any urgent matters arise, please email the principal and/or assistant principal, as we will check our email accounts periodically. Please use this time to take a break from the demands of virtual learning. We recognize the limits of travel and fun with family and friends during the break. Dr. Aderhold has shared a series of online resources in the form of a <u>Padlet</u> with varied virtual opportunities for museums, zoos and many other venues. **Virtual learning will resume Monday, April 20.**

As virtual learning resumes, please know that the next set of activities are still in the planning stage. Therefore, we are not able to post them in advance. Typically, we have been posting learning activities on the district website on Sunday evenings. Teachers communicate the new activities to their classes on Monday mornings. We recognize the timing may be a concern, but please know that there are not specific deadlines for the activities.
