- Remind your child to keep his/her camera on unless otherwise indicated by the teacher. The teacher needs to be able to monitor your child's focus, understanding, and attention to task.
- For maximum success, students in Grades 2 and 3 need to work with their
 District Chromebook. These District devices are programmed for immediate
 access to learning platforms and are capable of utilizing QR codes for ease and
 navigation. This also facilitates the teacher's observation of student performance.
 The district is currently working on distribution of devices for students in Grade 1
 and Kindergarten.
