Student Supplemental Supply Pick-Up: Materials have been distributed to hybrid students. If you have a virtual Kindergarten through 3rd grade student and have not yet picked up your supplies, you can come to the front door of Dutch Neck School between 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. The bags include hands-on tools to enhance instruction for upcoming units.
