#### **Food Services**

As a participant in the National School Lunch Program, all WW-P students are extended the opportunity to receive free breakfasts and lunches due to the ongoing COVID-19 health emergency. The March 22 food distribution will contain two weeks of breakfasts and lunches. Due to spring break, there will not be food distribution during the week of March 29. Food distribution will resume on Tuesday, April 6.
