# **Wicoff Elementary School**

Schools will be closed for Spring Break March 29 through April 5. Board Offices will be closed April 2. WW-P will be fully remote Tuesday, April 6, - Friday, April 9. ### **IMPORTANT:**

- **Spring Break:** All WW-P schools will be closed Monday, March 29, through Sunday, April 4, for spring break. Schools will also be closed Monday, April 5, as the day was a designated emergency closing day that was not used. Virtual board offices are closed Friday, April 2.
  - School will resume after spring break with fully remote instruction for ALL students April 6 April 9. In-person instruction will resume Monday, April 12, with Hybrid Week 1 and All-In students.

# • Learning Model Changes

- Students who requested and were accommodated with a change to All-In or Hybrid Week 1 will begin in-person learning Monday, April 12.
- Those students who requested and were accommodated with a change to Hybrid Week 2 will be in-person the week of April 19.
- Schedules for those students who will remain with their current learning model will remain unchanged.
- The **Technology Help Center** located at High School South will be closed during spring break and will reopen Tuesday, April 13.
- Health Reminder: During spring break and the week of April 6, parents are asked to email your child's school nurse if your student, or anyone in your household:
  - Is ill with COVID-19 symptoms
  - Has had close contact (within 6 ft. for 15 minutes or more within a 24 hour period) with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19
  - Has tested positive for COVID-19 during spring break or during the fully virtual week

 Has traveled/will be traveling outside of the state or country the weeks of March 29 and/or April 5 as the District is abiding by a 10-day quarantine for travel outside of NJ/NY/PA/DE/CT.
