- The Integrated Preschool <u>waitlist</u> registration is open! The program is available to a limited number of students for the 2021-22 school year. The waitlist is not a guarantee for a seat in next year's classroom. We are currently working on the schedule and determining a safe number of students for each classroom.
- There is no cost to register for the waitlist. When spaces become available, Community Education will notify you by phone and email.
 Students must be 3- or 4-years-old by Oct. 1, 2021, and independently toilet trained as well as WW-P district residents.

Food Services
