• Integrated Preschool

- The Integrated Preschool <u>waitlist</u> registration is open! The program is available to a limited number of students for the 2021-22 school year. The waitlist is not a guarantee for a seat in next year's classroom. We are currently working on the schedule and determining a safe number of students for each classroom.
- There is no cost to register for the waitlist. When spaces become available, Community Education will notify you by phone and email. Students must be 3- or 4-years-old by Oct. 1, 2021, and independently toilet trained as well as WW-P district residents.

 Set up your Community Pass account <u>here</u>. When registering, look for the 2021-22 Integrated Preschool and Extended Day Program heading. You must register through Community Pass first.

Food Services

- Distribution for WW-P students who currently receive food benefits will occur on a **weekly basis.** Distribution will be held Mondays (unless otherwise noted due to the school calendar) at High School North from 3-6 p.m. Families who receive benefits will continue to receive emails asking for a response regarding participation for the coming week. Completing the registration form in the weekly email is required prior to pick up.
- In conjunction with the federal government and the New Jersey Department of Agriculture, a waiver has been issued that allows school-aged children access to nutritious meals.
