Back to School Nights - We hope you enjoyed your BTSN presentations and found them informative. The Wicoff staff members were thrilled to spend time with you, so you could learn all about your child's programs. Let's continue our open lines of communication between home and school throughout this school year.

Below are some important dates to place on your calendars:

• Oct. 12, 13, 14 (evening) and 15 - Virtual Parent/Teacher Conference: These are early dismissal days and dismissal is at 1 p.m.

Below are some important reminders regarding drop-off and pick-up:

If you are dropping-off your child in the morning, please park in the church parking lot (adjacent to Wicoff School) and walk your child to the front entrance of the building.

Please DO NOT drive in the bus lane in the front of the school building to drop-off your child as this interferes with our buses.

If you are picking-up your child at the end of the school day, you need to send a note with your child stating this information. If this is an everyday occurrence one note explaining this will cover pick-up for the school year. If this is NOT an everyday occurrence you will need to write a note each time. Please also note our Parent Pick-Up location has changed. Parents picking-up their child(ren) at the end of the day will report to the middle door in the front of the building. We call this the third grade hallway doors or Door # 13.

Please continue to be patient with our school buses these first couple of weeks. We will continue to call one or two buses at a time for dismissal until our students get familiar with our bus procedures. It is a slow process initially, which begins at 3:15PM, but once the students are comfortable with the process it will become second-nature for them, running smoothly and more efficiently.

As always, the safety and comfort of our students is our top priority!

- **Contact Information:** Is your contact information up-to-date in Genesis? If your email or phone numbers have changed, please make sure to update your information in Genesis. If you would like to opt-in to receive SMS text messages from the District, please text "Yes" to "67587" from a cellphone that is listed in your contact information in Genesis. - **Masks**: All students, staff, and visitors are required to wear a mask while indoors regardless of vaccination status except under specified reasons that impact an individual's health. Valve masks and neck gaiters are not permitted for

- use in school or District grounds. Unvaccinated individuals are recommended to wear masks in outdoor settings.
- Health Screening: For the 2021-22 school year, parents/guardians should ONLY complete a Health Screening Form in the Genesis Parent Portal for their child(ren) if one or more of the exclusion issues listed on the School Exclusion Chart apply to their child(ren). Upon completion of a health screening form in Genesis, parents/guardians should keep their child(ren) home and contact their school nurse for instructions.
- **Back-to-School Nights**: This year all <u>Back to School Nights</u> will be held virtually. Additional details and links will be provided by the schools closer to the event.
