Important reminders regarding drop-off and pickup: If you are dropping off your child in the morning, please park in the church parking lot (adjacent to Wicoff School) and walk your child to the front entrance of the building. Please DO NOT drive in the bus lane in the front of the school building to drop-off your child as this interferes with our buses.

If you are picking up your child at the end of the school day, you need to send a note with your child stating this information. If this is an everyday occurrence one note explaining this will cover pickup for the school year. If this is NOT an everyday occurrence you will need to write a note each time. Please also note our Parent Pickup location has changed. Parents picking up their child(ren) at the end of the day will report to the middle door in the front of the building. We call this the third grade hallway doors or Door #13.

Please continue to be patient with our school buses these first couple of weeks. We will continue to call one or two buses at a time for dismissal until our students get familiar with our bus procedures. It is a slow process initially, which begins at 3:15 p.m., but once the students are comfortable with the process it will become second-nature for them, running smoothly and more efficiently.

As always, the safety and comfort of our students is our top priority!

- **Health Screening**: For the 2021-22 school year, parents/guardians should ONLY complete a Health Screening Form in the <u>Genesis Parent Portal</u> for their child(ren) if one or more of the exclusion issues listed on the <u>School Exclusion</u> <u>Chart</u> apply to their child(ren). Upon completion of a health screening form in Genesis, parents/guardians should keep their child(ren) home and contact their school nurse for instructions.

- Effective Oct. 1: **Updated student health and safety protocols** for home football games
 - WW-P North and South students must show their current student ID or be able to provide their ID number.

- Middle school and elementary school aged students must be accompanied by a supervising adult to enter the game. The supervising adult must remain with the student(s) for the duration of their attendance at the game.
- Students may not carry book bags/bags/etc. into the game.
- Students may not loiter in areas outside the fenced stadium or on school property.
- WW-P continues to recommend that spectators at outdoor events utilize facial coverings when not able to socially distance.
- WW-P sports fans are reminded that face coverings are required by all individuals (students, parents/guardians and visitors) while inside District facilities to attend an indoor event no matter their vaccination status.
