



85% of grade 11 and grade 12 students scored 3 or above on at least one AP test in the 2020-2021 school year



Executive Order No. 117 (4.7.20)

"As a state, we must continue to adapt to the new reality that COVID-19 has created in our state, a task that our students and educators are navigating every day," said Governor Murphy. "The waiver of these student assessment requirements will ensure that no student is left behind or unduly penalized due to these extraordinary circumstances."

On June 5, 2019, the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) updated the high school graduation assessment requirements in both English language arts (ELA) and mathematics for the classes of 2019 through 2022, pursuant to an amended Consent Order issued by the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of New Jersey.

Testlets include questions from one or more of the standards that teachers use for instruction during the school year.




Student test over several days.

Subject Area Tested	Number of Testlets	Approximate length of time, depending on grade level and student's individual needs
English language arts	9 testlets	90-135 minutes
Mathematics	6-8 testlets	60-120 minutes
Science	9 testlets	45 – 125 minutes



Dynamic Learning Maps Grades 3-8 and 11








