Technology

- District issued Chromebooks for students in grades kindergarten through grade 3 are kept in the classroom.
- District issued Chromebooks for students in grades 4-12 are for students to use both in school and to take home.
 - Students should bring their fully charged Chromebooks to school with them each day.
 - Charging cords should remain at home.
 - Middle school families: The Chromebook cover from last year's device should be used on this year's device. If you do not have a cover from last year, please follow the process at your school to submit tech ticket so that we can provide a cover.
- District Chromebooks need to be brought to school and logged in to by each student prior to State testing.
 - Students should bring the device to school, log in to the District device with their District email and test that their device is in good working order. If any issues are discovered, please follow the process at your school to submit a tech ticket for support.
