- Must be from an Accredited Institution
- Must Meet NJ Student Learning Standards
- Students Must Show Minimum Proficiency to Earn WW-P Credit (70%)
- March 31st Deadline to apply for summer work
- Limit One Course Per School Year
- Limit One Per Content Area
- Courses May Not Be Re-Taken
- Courses Must Be Completed by Fall of Sr. Year

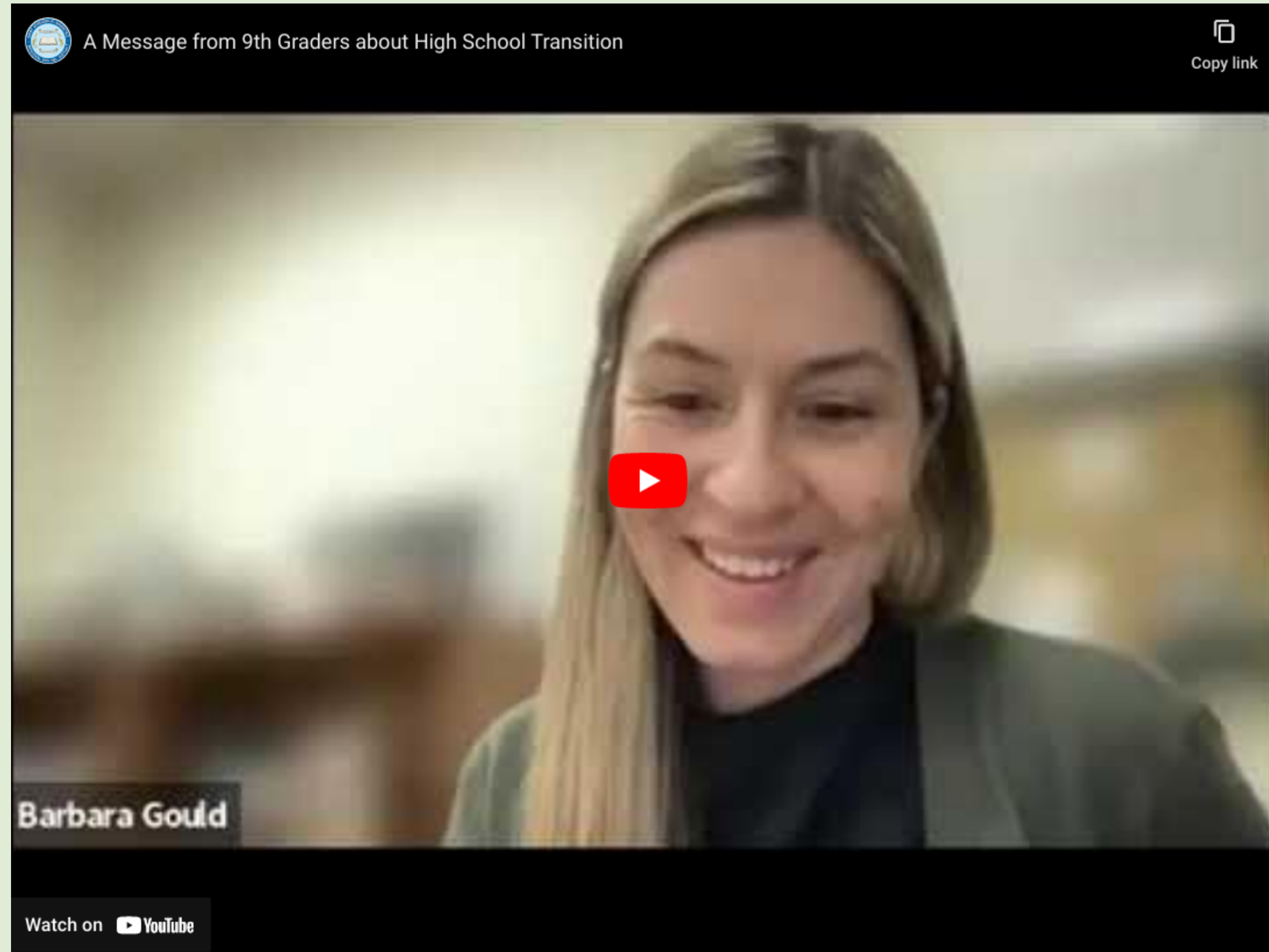
