 - o SCIENCE FAIR DATE: Saturday, March 16, 2024, 10 a.m. 12 p.m.
 - Registration information will be coming soon.
 - Students should be able to do most of the work on the project on their own but it's ok to talk to a teacher or a parent if they need some help.
 - Looking for ideas or guidelines about how to help your child so he or she has a successful, fun and safe project for the fair? Just continue reading below! You can sign up by yourself or with a team of 1 or 2 friends or siblings (from the Dutch Neck School) and then it's time to get to work, asking questions, exploring possibilities and finding answers! Working with others gives your child the opportunity to share ideas and discoveries. If working in a team, please help make sure that each team member has the chance to contribute to the project. A science fair project attempts to answer a question posed by your child. It requires research, organization and the desire to find answers to real-life questions. It does not need to be complicated or complex in nature. The more focused and specific the question the scientist asks, the easier it can be to research and present the findings. Therefore, the first thing a young scientist needs to do is select an appropriate topic and ask an appropriate scientific question. You can help guide your child in this process keeping in mind that the goal is to make sure this is a project, and a process that is driven

by your child's curiosity and not the parent's desire to have a perfect presentation. When you register, let us know which category of project the team is creating:

- Experiment
- Research
- Apparatus
- Demonstration
- Collection
- SAFETY: Be sure to select a project that does not risk harm to your child or anyone (or anything) else. DO NOT work with dangerous chemicals, fire, explosives, poisonous reptiles, or water with electricity.
- O SCIENCE FAIR RESTRICTIONS:
 - No open or closed flames are allowed.
 - No live animals may be brought into the school.
 - No hazardous or poisonous materials may be used.
 - No explosives can be used.
- The Science Fair is meant to be a fun experience for your child and one that encourages their curiosity with the world around them. If you need some help getting ideas of age-appropriate topics, check out some of the links below (or check out the ever-popular Pinterest!) to help get your child started thinking about what he or she might want to explore for the Science Fair.

- From the Health Office: If your child has symptoms of illness during the previous evening, consider making arrangements for your child to remain at home. Rest and early attention will often shorten the illness. It will also help cut down on the spread of germs at school. Sending a sick child to school not only endangers the health of all others but also increases your child's susceptibility to other illnesses to which they may be exposed. Please be reminded of the district policy regarding when children must stay home from school. Our district illness exclusion policies require students to be vomit, diarrhea, and fever free for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medication, before they may

return to school. If you have questions about our health policies you may call Mrs. Lavan at 609-716-5400 or email her at brenda.lavan@wwprsd.org.

- Consider keeping your child home if they have symptoms that prevent them from participating in school, such as:
 - Excessive tiredness or lack of appetite
 - Persistent coughing that could be distracting to your child and disruptive to the class.
 - Headache, body aches, earache
 - Unexplained rashes, sores, and crusty, inflamed eyes or other signs of contagious illness
 - Cold or runny nose if nasal discharge is excessive and/or not clear.
 - Sore throat a minor sore throat is usually not a problem, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat even if there is no fever. Other symptoms of strep throat in children are headache and stomach upset.
 - Children with "strep throat" or impetigo infections must remain home for 24 hours after the first antibiotic has been given.
 - If a diagnosis of pink eye has been made, children must remain home for 24 hours after antibiotics have been given, and/or until all drainage has stopped.
