## **SCHOOL**

- **Spring Forward!:** Remember to 'spring forward' your clocks one hour on Sunday, March 10!
  - Fun Facts: Daylight saving became a federal law in 1966 with the goal of conserving energy. 60 percent of countries in the world keep 'standard time' and do not shift in the fall and spring. Springing forward provides one hour of extra daylight in the evening so outdoor activities (barbeque, golf, etc.) have been large proponents of the law. There are several states considering an end to the practice of shifting the time twice a year.
  - Tips for Children: Daylight saving can be hard on little ones. Some tips to ease the transition include:
    - Start slowly- shifting 20 mins over three days (or 10 minutes over six days) is a much easier transition.
    - Mimic the light- in spring, start dimming down the lights (electronics too!) 30 mins before bed and wake up with as much light as you can! In the fall, do the opposite- keep the shades dark in the morning until it is time for the kiddos to rise.
    - Stick to your routines! Sleep is so important for young children and a good routine will help. As long as the routine is the same, a shift in time is less impactful!
- **SEL** (**Social Emotional Learning**) **Day**: Staff and students celebrated SEL Day today, March 8. They participated in some activities that focused on their well being. Please ask your children about it! Also, please take some time to see some resources that have been gathered for parents and caregivers and a couple videos that explain what SEL means for school and beyond.

- From the Health Office: If your child has symptoms of illness during the previous evening, consider making arrangements for your child to remain at home. Rest and early attention will often shorten the illness. It will also help cut down on the spread of germs at school. Sending a sick child to school not only

endangers the health of all others but also increases your child's susceptibility to other illnesses to which they may be exposed. Please be reminded of the district policy regarding when children must stay home from school. Our <u>district illness</u> <u>exclusion policies</u> require students to be vomit, diarrhea, and fever free for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medication, before they may return to school. - Consider keeping your child home if they have symptoms that prevent them from participating in school, such as:
  - Excessive tiredness or lack of appetite
  - Persistent coughing that could be distracting to your child and disruptive to the class.
  - Headache, body aches, earache
  - Unexplained rashes, sores, and crusty, inflamed eyes or other signs of contagious illness
  - Cold or runny nose if nasal discharge is excessive and/or not clear.
  - Sore throat a minor sore throat is usually not a problem, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat even if there is no fever. Other symptoms of strep throat in children are headache and stomach upset.
  - Children with "strep throat" or impetigo infections must remain home for 24 hours after the first antibiotic has been given.
  - If a diagnosis of pink eye has been made, children must remain home for 24 hours after antibiotics have been given, and/or until all drainage has stopped.

# Reminders

- 2023-2024 School Year Calendar: With the use of three emergency closing days (Jan. 16, 2024, Jan. 19, and Feb. 13, 2024) all WW-P schools and board offices will be open April 24, April 1, and May 24, 2024.
  - Based on the Jan. 16, Jan. 19, and Feb. 13 closures the <u>school year</u> <u>calendar</u>, <u>half-day preschool calendar</u> and report card calendars for <u>PK-8</u> and <u>grades 9-12</u> have been updated.
- **Grade 11 NJGPA Testing:** March 12-15, WW-P grade 11 students will take the NJGPA assessment. High School North and High School South ONLY will run a revised schedule and two morning bus runs on those dates. Grade 11 students

will come in at their usual time. Students in grades 9, 10, and 12 will be picked up on a second bus run approximately 2 hours later than their usual pickup time and will have a delayed school start time of 9:40 a.m. All high school students will have a revised class schedule for March 12-15.

- WW-P Elementary School Parent/Teacher Conferences and Early Dismissal March 22, 2024: All WW-P elementary schools will have an early dismissal and parent/teacher conferences Friday, March 22, 2024. Half-day preschool is closed. No food services will be provided March 22.
- **Spring Recess March 25-29, 2024:** All WW-P schools will be closed for Spring Recess Monday, March 25, through Friday, March 29, 2024. Schools will reopen Monday, April 1, 2024. District board offices will be closed Friday, March 29.
