• STEAM NIGHT! Wednesday April 3!:

- We are very excited to invite you and your family to enjoy STEAM Night at Dutch Neck School on Wednesday, April 3, 2024, from 6-7:30 p.m. In your child's backpack, you will see a green paper about signing up for STEAM Night events. Please be sure to read the sign up directions carefully:
 - There will be ticketed and non-ticketed events for you and your family to enjoy.
 - Please note if you have multiple children that attend Dutch Neck School and will be attending sessions, you will need to fill the form out again for each child (1 child per form)
 - When selecting an event, please use your child's first and last name rather than your own. This will help with distributing tickets

to your child in school. Please also add your child's teacher's name to the notes section at sign up.

- Although you will see there are 3 sessions, please only select 1 or 2 events per child to attend. We ask this so that all of our Dutch Neck families have a chance to share in the experience.
- Please note this is a free and family event- guardians need to attend with children.
- <u>Click here</u> to sign up for STEAM Night events.
- From the Health Office: If your child has symptoms of illness during the previous evening, consider making arrangements for your child to remain at home. Rest and early attention will often shorten the illness. It will also help cut down on the spread of germs at school. Sending a sick child to school not only endangers the health of all others but also increases your child's susceptibility to other illnesses to which they may be exposed. Please be reminded of the district policy regarding when children must stay home from school. Our <u>district illness</u> exclusion policies require students to be vomit, diarrhea, and fever free for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medication, before they may return to school. If you have questions about our health policies you may call Mrs. Lavan at 609-716-5400 or email her at <u>brenda.lavan@wwprsd.org</u>.
 - *Consider keeping your child home if they* have symptoms that prevent them from participating in school, such as:
 - Excessive tiredness or lack of appetite
 - Persistent coughing that could be distracting to your child and disruptive to the class.
 - Headache, body aches, earache
 - Unexplained rashes, sores, and crusty, inflamed eyes or other signs of contagious illness
 - Cold or runny nose if nasal discharge is excessive and/or not clear.
 - Sore throat a minor sore throat is usually not a problem, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat even if there is no fever.
 Other symptoms of strep throat in children are headache and stomach upset.
 - Children with "strep throat" or impetigo infections must remain home for 24 hours after the first antibiotic has been given.
 - If a diagnosis of pink eye has been made, children must remain home for 24 hours after antibiotics have been given, and/or until all drainage has stopped.
